STUDENT STAGE ASSISTANT

JOB SUMMARY

Under close supervision, selected high school students assist with stage operations during permitted events; perform related duties as assigned.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

The classification specification does not describe all duties performed by all incumbents within the class. This summary provides examples of typical tasks performed in this classification.

- Assist with stage operations during events and productions including scene, lighting, sound and curtain changes. *E*
- Assist in the set up and strike down of sets. E
- Assist in operating computerized lighting, sound, and projection equipment including multi-channel microphones, audio systems and intelligent lighting systems. *E*
- Assist with housekeeping and general cleanliness of stage and adjacent facilities. E
- Learn effective and safe use of stage equipment. E
- Learn how to maintain effective relationships with co-workers and supervisors. E
- Learn and follow established safety and health procedures. E
- May collect tickets and usher audience members to their seats.
- Perform related duties as assigned.

Note: At the end of some of the duty statements there is an italicized **E**, which identifies essential duties, required of the classification. This is strictly for use in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act.

DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS

Incumbents in this classification are high school students of the Long Beach Unified School District. This classification is exempt from the merit system in accordance with Education Code 45256 (Full-time students employed part-time).

EMPLOYMENT STANDARDS

Participants must meet current academic achievement levels for their grade and be a student in otherwise good standing.

WORKING ENVIRONMENT

Theater environment.

Evening and weekend hours.

Working at heights.

Working around and with machinery having moving parts.

Exposure to dirt, dust, paint and other solvents.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

Dexterity of hands and fingers to operate equipment and tools.

Seeing to perform work.

Standing and walking for extended periods of time.

Lifting, carrying, pushing and pulling heavy objects such as sets, scenery and props.

Climbing ladders, stairs and scaffolding.

Reaching overhead, above the shoulders and horizontally.

Bending at the waist, kneeling, crouching, or crawling.

AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

Persons with certain disabilities may be capable of performing the essential duties of this class with or without reasonable accommodation, depending on the nature of the disability.
